country that will be equipped to handle 100% electric vehicle fleet. The rental car companies are in the planning stage to provide the infrastructure for an all-electric fleet.

These are great educational topics for this Committee and to see where we are on the spectrum in terms of impact and or possible mitigations that are in the years ahead.

He asked if the committee would like to continue with the hybrid of having the meeting in person and via zoom as most of the other Committees have returned to in-person meetings. The consensus was to stay with the hybrid model for this Committee moving forward.
